Beginning with memories from an aged former slave, the story includes descriptions of the old town at various times in the 19th and 20th centuries, the early plight of children, a visit to the Bell Pottery Shop, the excitement before and during the Civil War, the arrival and passing of railroads and the trolley, the machine-tool industries, local "characters," rambles along Antietam creek, 20th-century modes of entertainment, champion football teams,

etc. It ends with the Author's own reminiscences about the town in the last half of the 20th century. A fifth-generation resident of Waynesboro, T. A. Dorsett knows the town well, and tells its story with a wit and sympathy that will endear it to readers.
